


The new scheme which I prefer to the JGG , is a combination of different shades of grey applied with an airbrush.

And that was how it was going to be left for the maiden flight. But then I decided to 3D print the exhausts.





With the day of the maiden flight approaching I just had time to fix the exhausts and to apply some of the decals but that's as far as I got.

Well I did give it the first coat of exhaust smudges too. Oh yeah, I also sprayed in the yellow bits as I thought that may well help when I fly it.



Printed the MG81Z machine guns (no real details on the stocks as they will be inside the canopy).




Having got the maiden flight out of the way it was time to continue with some more detailing.





Both rear gunner and pilot are gradually sinking into a bath of oil!

Dash printed and fitted (radio operator's dash will come later).





The hornet decals added (second attempt as I put them on upside down to start with!!).



The only things left to do are the front machine guns, the radio operator's dash board and final weathering to the airframe. I have to say that it is a real joy to fly and looks quite realistic in the air. As it has a fixed tailwheel I've setup asymmetric throttles for the engines controlled by the rudder stick which not only helps with ground handling for taxiing but also for keeping it straight on take off in a crosswind.
