EAST ANGLIAN FREE FLIGHT GALA: 31 July and 1 August, 2021



The East Anglia Area Free Flight Gala will be held over the weekend 31st July-1st Aug on Sculthorpe Airfield, Fakenham, Norfolk. Uniquely this year the historic Bowden Contest will be held at the Gala. The Bowden Contest is, at its simplest a precision free flight competition for sport models where you judge your engine run and glide to land at the target time of 45secs. Crazy, not at all easy but good fun!

The airfield is situated about four miles west of Fakenham on the north side of the A148 Kings Lynn Road. For access turn off the A148 onto the B1454 road for Docking, in about 300yds on the right are double metal gates - the only point of entry. In all probability this gate will be manned from shortly before 9a.m for the greater part of both days - you will need to show proof of BMFA membership. If you arrive late, phone one of the numbers displayed on the gate. In either case then proceed to F/F control and sign the register. Please note NO DOGS are allowed on the airfield at any time.

Classes to be flown include:- E36; P30; C02; Tailless; Mini Vintage; Vintage Rubber/Power; Vintage Glider; Classic Glider; Classic Rubber/Power; and Combined Glider, Rubber and Power (3 separate events).

Although the Gala is first and foremost a competitive event, free flight flyers are very welcome to come along and enjoy their flying on this vast airfield.

Control Line Flying in East Anglia

Proposed BMFA East Anglia Area Control line Gala.

In view of a noted increase in interest in Control Line flying within the East Anglia Area, It has been suggested that the BMFA East Anglia Area Committee looks into the possibility of funding and running an event to celebrate & encourage the growth of Control Line flying.

We want to hear from any members of clubs in the East Anglia area who would be interested in taking part and /or help organise such an event.

General Overview and aims:-

- 1. The event would be called The East Anglia Control line Gala.
- 2. The event would be held at a location accessible to as many area club members as possible.
- 3. The event would be exclusively for Control Line flying (IC and electric).
- 4. Emphasis would be on fun and to celebrate control Line flying in all its forms, but a low key competitive element may be introduced to the event.
- 5. The aim is to cater for as many styles as possible. Depending on interest shown, this would include General Sport Flying, Carrier Deck, Combat, Scale, Stunt (Vintage and/or F2b) and grass Team Racing in some form, plus small capacity speed (eg Weatherman). Only definite exception at this stage would be anything ultra noisy such as Pulse Jets.
- 6. It is considered vital that there is a practical training programme available to encourage complete novices and to help anybody wanting to advance their existing CL skills. Volunteers will be required for this.
- Initially, this would likely be a one day late summer event with appropriate facilities (toilets etc.). Future events would depend on interest shown, but could include availability of food and camping.

Progress and issues arising:-

- 1. We are currently searching for a central (to the area) Control Line friendly location. It must be noise tolerant and have car parking and toilet facilities. Most options to date are on the periphery and this puts a travelling penalty on those furthest away.
- 2. We are aware of other events such as at Old Warden and Peterborough which are either not in the area or are on the edge of it. We do not wish to compete with those events.
- 3. It is anticipated that event number one would be quite a small affair to judge interest.
- 4. Event rules to control excessive noise, local disruption and safety are being drawn up.

The Area committee wishes to hear from any members or clubs that have suggestions, or wish to help bring this event into being. Please let John Copsey know if you are interested.

British Model Flying Association Centenary 2022

2022 promises to be an exciting year for model flying. Hopefully we will have a full years flying with the various National Championships reinstated and the opportunity to celebrate and promote model flying.

The Society of Model Aeronautical Engineers (SMAE) now known as the BMFA was founded in 1922.

Nationally a number of events are being planned including:

- An exhibition charting the history and future of model flying at Buckminster
- A promotional film
- A Gala Dinner
- A mass participation world record attempt
- Mega Flight Fest events
- A new one design FF model, electrically powered by a capacitor and compliant with FAI class rules for simple ARTF entry level models.

At Area level we are starting to plan for next year with a focus on recruiting new model flyers and it would be great if clubs were, even now, start to plan local events to spread the good news of model flying.

Model Aircraft Precision Aerobatics by Peter Jenkins

If you always spin out of outside loops or tumble out of stall turns then Peter Jenkins new book on aerobatics might be what you are looking for. Peter is a previous Area Chairman and Delegate and is a keen F3A competitor. Peter describes his book as being;


"A guide for both beginners as well as improvers to model aircraft precision aerobatics, or F3A, competition focused on the UK. However, it is just as relevant anywhere else in the world as the issue of how to control an aerobatic model aircraft is not limited to a single geography! If you are not interested in entering competitions, this book will bring you some of the knowledge and techniques that you would only pick up by attending them. If you are sufficiently disciplined in your flying, there is no reason why you should not reach a good

aerobatic standard after following the advice and guidance contained in this book.

The book covers the basics of starting aerobatic flying, from when you have just gone solo, to helping you to get ready to take up the challenge of flying in aerobatic competitions.

The book contains advice on how to set up your aircraft covering for example: centre of gravity position; engine/motor thrust lines; and control throws. It then takes you through the basics of aerobatic manoeuvres with both diagrams and words. Once over this initial phase, you will get much more detail about set up and trimming as well as how to fly large smooth manoeuvres ultimately taking account of the impact of the wind on the flight.

The book contains a chapter on mini training schedules that allow you to build up your skills before describing how to fly the entry level



aerobatic competition schedule used in Great Britain. Finally, I have included references to how you can access the resources to help you to progress from a practical flying viewpoint.

The book is available as follows:

- via <u>Amazon</u> either as a Kindle (£6.99) or paperback (currently discounted by 20% at £15.93 full price is £19.99) it is eligible for Prime delivery ie free otherwise P&P is charged.
